Dear Cathedral Family,

The Chimes is back! You may have noticed that it has been six months since you received a Chimes issue in your mailbox. During that time, the Communications Committee has been hard at work considering Cathedral communications. They surveyed the congregation about how you receive and engage with the emails, social media offerings, and mailings sent from the Cathedral. Additionally, three focus groups met to offer feedback and their thoughts about the Chimes (mailed and emailed) and email communications.

Out of discussion of the feedback from the survey and the focus groups these purposes and audiences were discerned:

- The Chimes is to foster community and engagement among members of the Cathedral, whether they live in the Spokane region or have moved further away. We heard you wanted to read stories about ministries & parishioners, have "Did You Know?" questions answered, hear from a variety of voices, and see photos of life at the Cathedral.
- The Friday Cathedral Connections email is sent to mostly members and its purpose is to inform about timely upcoming events, offer updates, and offer opportunities for connection. We heard you wanted brief content, news snippets, and a format that highlights ways to participate in the next couple of weeks.
- ♦ The Monday Collects email extends Sunday's worship into the week. We heard you appreciated having these brief prayer resources.
- The Cathedral's website, www.stjohns-cathedral.org, and Facebook page, @stjohnscathedralspokane, are public ways of communicating about the Cathedral. Events and gatherings that are shared on these platforms are truly open to anyone. Specific information about small groups, committee meetings, or similar gatherings are generally not shared on these public spaces.

The Communications Committee decided that the Chimes will be produced six times a year – not seasonally and not monthly. Additionally, this is the last edition of the Chimes that will be mailed to every household – including those who have asked to receive the Chimes via email. The Chimes will continue to be mailed to those who live further away and those who cannot access it online. *If you want to remain on this list, you must contact the Cathedral Office.* For all who regularly attend worship at the cathedral, copies of the Chimes will be available for pickup when you come to worship on the weekend or during the week in the welcome center.

Over the next six months, keep your eyes peeled for changes in design to Cathedral email blasts and the Chimes itself. Thanks to the members of the Communications Committee: chair Meredith Shimizu, Amanda Glover, Andrea Matters, Robin Rauzi, Jayne Touchstone, and Fr. Arlen.



Our beloved organ console was delivered at the end of June along with some of our freshly cleaned pipes! Next steps include electrical work and pulling wires for the updated power source, after which Marceau & Co. will return to finish the installation, cleaning of on-site pipes,

re-leathering work, and tuning. Once the instrument has settled— and possibly after a tuning follow-up— it will be ready to play.

I know we are all excited to hear and feel our beloved organ echo through the sanctuary and I assure you that nobody is more eager to get back on the bench than Scott Rednour! (The last time he played our organ was in 2021 for the Symphony Chorale concert).

Scott comes to us with extensive experience as a collaborative pianist and vocal coach for myriad Opera Companies, Summer Music Festivals. He has performed in many concerts in Europe and across North America and has taught music at Manhattan School of Music, The Juilliard School, Whitworth University, and is currently teaching at Eastern Washington University. Scott also has extensive experience from the organ bench, most recently as Music Director for St. Michael's Episcopal Church in Manhattan's Upper West Side. I am looking forward to our partnered leadership of music at St. John's Cathedral.

### HFC and Beyond: Engaging in Creation Care Ministry

The broad question that came out of the Hope for Creation conference was, "What are your priorities for the next phase of activity on creation care at the Cathedral?" Here are some responses from our congregation:

- Landscape as a form of outreach grounded in theology—taking intentional conservation measures on our own property. We can consider zeroscaping the grounds (particularly the north lawn), planting a pollinator garden, invigorating/expanding our community garden, and looking into having solar panels installed on the roof.
- Educate ourselves—use our liturgy to emphasize creation care and acknowledge indigenous history and spirituality rooted in this particular land that we occupy. The 5:30pm Saturday worship service uses liturgy rooted in creation care theology. The service music used at the 10:30am Sunday worship all summer has been an intentional effort to honor indigenous traditions.
- Stewardship of the relationships we have established with outside groups—partnering with and supporting extant groups in our community that work across faith traditions and party lines to foster the health of our world, like our mission partners at WAIPL and community partners at Riverkeepers.

Want to learn more? The Creation Care ministry will meet the third Sunday of each month after the 10:30am service, kicking off at the Ministry Fair. Come check it out!
